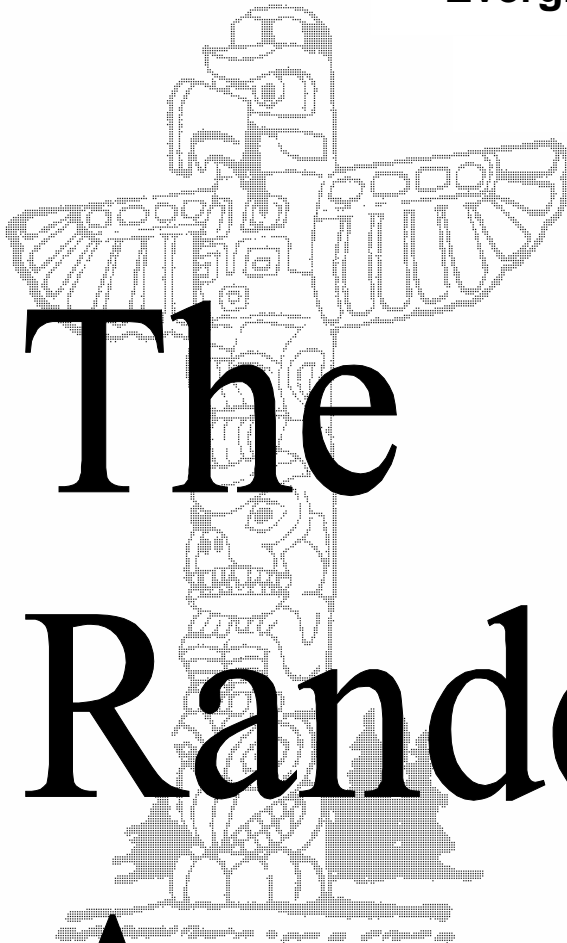

# The Board of Directors... What they Did...

**Evergreen Chapter, AITP Board of Directors Meeting**  
26 April 2005; Amante Pizza & Pasta, Lynnwood

**Present:** Association Director and Chapter President, Robbin (Ol'Dogg) Boston, CDP; Treasurer and Immediate Past President Kim Fischer, CDP; Secretary, David M. Chapin, CSM and Executive Vice President, Byron Thom.

**Excused Absences:** Director Jillian H. Chapin.

Approval of **March minutes** as published in the March *Random Access*.

## **Officer Reports:**

**Association Director** – Robbin Boston – Reported on his trip to the Region 2 Director's Meeting in Boise (and his trip associated 18-hole score of 101). Represented were about six of the nine Region chapters. Discussed at the meeting were financing the Region by applying a \$5 Region Membership surcharge (details to follow) and applying "targets" and "measurements" to region activities. Also suggested was putting out the Region's newsletter – The Informer – in PDF format. [At this point, those of us familiar with the process start explaining to the old COBOL programmer what is needed, how the document must be reorganized, and how to process the document to a set of eyeballs rapidly glazing over.]

**President** – Robbin Boston – See about half of the above.

**Executive Vice President** – Byron



Thom – No report  
**Secretary** – David Chapin – To be published  
**Treasurer** – Kim Fischer – Report to be published. Kim did find the outstanding check from the Association in

the materials transferred from the mailbox and has now deposited that check.

**Immediate Past President** – Kim Fischer – No report

**Region Events Exchange Committee** – Dave Chapin – Back in operation. Mr. Boston reported that favorable comments were heard about this project at the Region Director's Meeting.

**Association E-Communications Committee** – Dave Chapin – This committee is looking very Association-typical – One big bang and then vapor lock. No intra-committee communications in a couple of months.

*[It was about at this point of the meeting that Mr. Thom impressed the waitress by knowing that Sophia was the capital of Bulgaria (her home country).]*

## **Committee Reports:**

**Advertising** – Byron Thom – No report

**Auditing** – Robbin Boston – Next scheduled Audit is August 2005.

**Awards** – Jillian Chapin – **2004 COPA** report submitted to the Association and to the Region President.

No way could the 2004 membership numbers be juggled to achieve COPA, but we did qualify for \$165.50 in PCS cash. Year-end results: Education 100%, Membership 58.1%, Public Relations 2,107.5%, Meetings 460%, and Association Participation 575% of goal. The rules do

allow moving points into Membership from any single other category, but not to exceed a specified percentage of goal and it would have taken more than that to reach a qualifying level.

**2005 COPA Progress: As of 26**

**April 2005.** Education, 0 points of the 6 points required for 0% of goal; Membership and Membership Retention – a problem; Public Relations, 147 points of the 12 points required for 1,225.0% of goal; Meetings, 14.5 points of the 18 required for 80.6% of goal; and Association Participation, 85 points of the 12 required or 708.3% of goal.

**Bylaws** – Dave Chapin – No outstanding requests.

**Community Service** – Byron Thom – No report

**Education** – Dave Chapin – No current activity.

**History** – Dave Chapin – Two on going projects (without progress... Scan the original Chapter Charter Certificate for Ol’Dogg Boston, and Work continues on making a list going back to the 1980’s of meeting dates, speakers, topics, and attendance numbers.

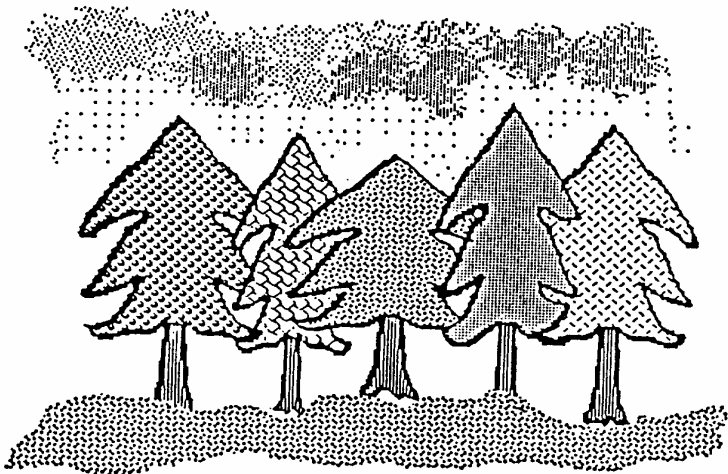

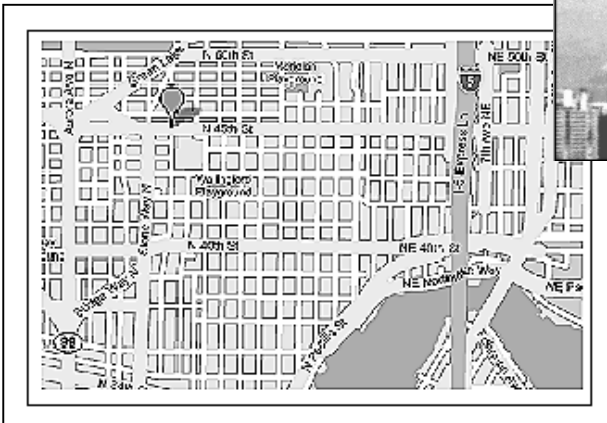

Background: Each year, members of the Association Board of Directors and any Officer or Director of any AITP sub-unit must agree to the organization's Conflict of Interest policy. We are pleased to announce that the Conflict of Interest Form is now available online.

Action: The Conflict of Interest Form must be reviewed and completed by ALL chapter leaders. This includes chapter/region officers and directors. Please review the Conflict of Interest Form and click on the submit button located at the bottom of the page if you agree to the terms.

### On-line IRS Tax Form

Background: The Internal Revenue Service Regulations regarding Chapters

and Regions include:

1. Chapters and Regions with less than \$25,000 in gross revenue do not need to file individual tax returns. Instead, a Group Exemption Return is filed at HQ listing all participating Chapters and Regions. In order to be included in the Group Exception Return, Chapters and Regions must approve their participation by remitting the Tax Reporting Form.
2. Chapters and Regions with over \$25,000 in gross revenue must file their own return but will be required to let HQ know that the return will be filed. A copy of the filing (completed return) must be remitted to HQ.

Action: Please click on the link provided above and elect whether or not your chapter will be included in the group exempt report. The form must be completed in both instances by May 15th. This form can be faxed or mailed to HQ.

# They Just Keep Pressing Those Hot Buttons!



If you are signed up for the Leadership News Forum on the Association's web site, you get a string of Emails – announcements from the Association. If you're listed as a Chapter Officer, you will get another copy. And if you appear in the list of officers (a Liaison between chapters) for another chapter, you'll get a third copy.

So, a couple of times a week there are three identical messages from the Association, Bing, Bing, Bing sitting in my In-Basket. It makes it hard to miss mail from the Association. And it is from these epistles that we gather the information published under "Association News."

But, let me backtrack a bit...

It, as you well know, I have a couple of "givens" in respect to the annual Awards / Association reports/contests

1. Once the rules are stated, no changes for the duration of the reporting period/contest. [Because once you state the rules, I'm going to concentrate on fulfilling each clause... Hey, you'll get what you measure, pure, clean, and that simple.]
2. That the rules be fully stated **BEFORE** the contest/reporting period begins.

And why is it that I get particularly exasperated with the Association / Awards process? Well, absolutely no one involved in that process understands that the Chapter Awards Committee is going to be spending a **LOT** of time collecting and filing data all year long.

Now, there are two methods you can use in collecting data for the COPA [Chapter Outstanding Performance Award]:

1. "The big box" (Open lid, dump object, and worry about where it is applicable next January)

or

2. Using the worksheet upon which the annual report will be filed, enter the event information in the proper category as you go through the year, and report at each Chapter Board Meeting the status of progress toward achieving COPA in the five categories. Thus, if the Board cares, the Officers can adjust their plans to put more emphasis on those areas falling behind goal. I prefer the latter as I have enough crap to do at year-

end and I don't need volunteer work stacking up into that calendar space. **BUT** this only works if the Awards Committee has finalized the rules and the worksheet with which the year will be reported **BEFORE** the reporting-year begins. No mid-year changes, no definition of Region Workshop changes, etc.

So much for COPA, can something as simple as the Annual Newsletter Contest be screwed up too? Ya, sure, you betcha it can!

No, I'm not asking that the committee announce in January of 2005 that the February and November issues of 2005 will be the ones upon which the contest is judged. [You know, that if they did, the chapter's newsletter for those two months would look like a glossy commercial magazine... I've got the equipment, and I'd do it...] I'm just asking that in January of 2006, as the contest is announced, that if there is to be a specific issue required, that it be published in **EVERY** announcement... to everyone... What, is it some sort of secret?

That brings me full circle to this year's aggravation...



Remember those Emails listed above... We read them. We pirated information out of them for publication in the chapter's newsletter. And we know that in the past, the Awards Committee **HAD** specified that a particular issue be included in the submission from each Chapter. We also know that without making any announcement that issue requirement was dropped in 2001. We didn't submit an entry into the 2001 contest because we couldn't find anyone at the Association who would tell us what was the required issue. And no one told us that there wasn't a required issue.

In 2002, and we still have copies of the Emails we sent to the Association Offices trying to find someone who knew what issue would be required, we were finally told that we should send "two copies each of any two issues that best represented our newsletter." We did that. However, the 2002 Association President, in what we consider to be a clear violation of the Association's Ethics Policies declared our entry invalid. He did not like our attitude of bringing problems out into view such that we might find resolutions. So, in spite of there being no provision in the contest rules to invalidate an entry, (all entries are subject only how well then meet the listed criteria) he did not permit our newsletter to be presented to the judges.

The rules for the 2003 issues appeared to be the same "no proscribed issue." We sent in our two favorites and placed first in our category.

Yet, all of this time, the Award Manuals were unchanged changed, suggesting that there might be a proscribed



issue, but failing to name such.

So here is the contest for the 2004 publishing year – we dig through the year's output, and reading nothing in that stream of announcements emanating out of the Association to the contrary, we shipped off the two best issues and moved on to other tasks.

As you can well imagine, we went sort of ballistic when the morning of the contest deadline (3/31/05) – after 6 AM Pacific Time – one of those announcements coming out of the Association **NOW** declared that the October 2004 issue would be required in a chapter's submission. And to go further, in a contest which has zero definitions about newsletters in an electronic format, the Awards Committee wanted to see as many of the submissions as Email attachments. [Maybe next year they'll want the category to include "audio books" with someone reading our newsletter to someone else...]

Just by luck, we just happened to have a copy of the PDF version of the newsletter created for our website (which omits some of the material contained in the printed version) and we Emailed that

copy along with our protest of this change and directions to find the hard-copies of the already submitted issues in the Headquarters mail.

So where does this get us... Well, I'm about the width of a paperclip from telling the Awards / Association where they can put their COPA and newsletter contests. Will that be good for the Chapter? No. But probably not a major affect either way on the Association which has shown little interest in the health of individual chapters... So who cares?

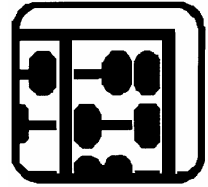
